



Shore Birds - "It's a shore thing"

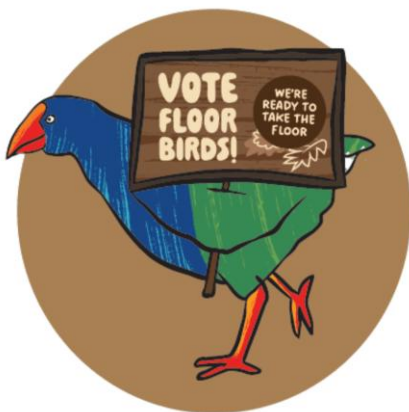
